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### Souvenirs

East Timor has some fascinating souvenirs. Coffee is one of the best products in this country and you can buy it for your family and friends. Tais is Timorese traditional hand-made fabric, and you can buy it in the Tais Market or Alola Foundation, which is located in front of the central post office. Moreover, Aroma Timor is one of the best local products, made by Timorese women. You cannot miss the tea and banana chips.



**How to go to Atauro**  
 You can buy a ticket at ticket center (see the map), and there are two types of boats. From Friday to Tuesday, you can ride on a smaller one. 1 way trip is for 45 minutes for \$13. On Thursday, You ride on a bigger one. 1 way trip is for 2-3 hours for \$5. The Boat leaves the port at 8:00 am for Atauro, and from Atauro to Dili, leaves at 3 pm. Atauro has beautiful nature, good hotels, restaurants, sea food, the beach, and adventure!



**How to send a letter from Dili**  
 There is a central post office in the center of the city. There, you can send letters and big packages to your countries. To send them, you just bring them to the post office, and write an address label which an officer will give you at the post office. Prices differ depending on weight of your package and destinations. (e.g. 20g for 50 cents-\$1, 2kg for \$45-\$65)


**Travelling in Dili without Wi-Fi**  
 Sometimes in Dili it is difficult to access Wi-Fi and you may be lost in the center of the city. You don't need to worry about it. You can download an application called "maps.me". After you download this app on your phone, you download East Timor's map. Then, you can use the map application without a network connection. Moreover, it has GPS, and it automatically shows where you are now in Dili! (\*In the countryside, GPS sometimes doesn't work well).

**How to shop at local markets**  
 Dili has a lot of local markets named Mercado, such as Taibeshi Market. There are lots of goods and food, such as local vegetable, fruits, clothes, and drinks. You can buy at cheaper prices compared to supermarkets. If you want to know the price, say "nee hira?" (How much is this?).

**How to get a SIM card**  
 You can buy a SIM card at any telephone companies in Dili. If you have a SIM free phone, you can use your phone with the SIM card, or you can buy one in phone companies, Timor Plaza, or any other phone shops (\$15\*). After you get a phone, you need to buy PULSA to add value to your phone.

**How to travel to Timor-Leste**  
 You can travel to Timor-Leste directly from Bali, Kupang, Darwin, and Singapore. You don't have to obtain a visa beforehand. After you arrive at the Dili airport, you can buy a tourist VISA for \$30 which will allow you to stay in Dili for a maximum of 1 month.

**How to eat at a warung**  
 Warung is a Timorese traditional style of restaurant. When you go to Warung, you can see various kinds of food available, and you can choose as many dishes as you want. The price differs depending on what you want to eat (\$1.50-\$6.00).



**How to look around Dili**  
 Microlet is also a good choice to look around the city. Microlet is a minibus, which runs 12 different routes. You can check each route at: <http://www.dilimicrolets.com>. Price is 25 cents for adults and 15 cents for Timorese students. When you want to stop a microlet, raise your hand, and when you want to get off, make a sound with coins tapping somewhere in the car.

**How to use a taxi**  
 Taxis are a good choice if you want to go to your destination fast. Dili has two kinds of taxis-Yellow Taxi and Blue Taxi. You need to decide how much money you pay when you catch a taxi. Price range is about \$3-5. (to go to the airport, \$10) Bule Taxi has a meter, so when you go further, you pay more. (Call a blue taxi: 7742 7777)
